


TITLE: Heritage Unit News: University Record Group

From Historical Collections & Archives (HCA):

The Health Sciences Campus Archives housed in the HCA are arranged by record groups based on the collection's function, office of origin, or format, such as the Office of the President or Student Affairs or Publications. The current five colleges on the Health Sciences Campus have a separate record groups.


Of all the record groups housed in the HCA, one of the largest is the Medical College of Georgia record group (RG07). Currently this record group consists of 19 boxes; approximately 7.9 linear feet of archival material and includes the following: annual reports of the college, accreditation papers, some teaching materials used in the past, MCG Dean's newsletters, and various programs and pamphlets for the college or departments within the Medical College of Georgia.

Medical College of Georgia Hooding Ceremony pamphlet (2019)




From Special Collections & Institutional Archives:

Augusta University records are housed here at Reese Library on the Summerville campus. Institutional records (IA) are classified according to department or subject, such as [Academic Affairs](#) or [University Libraries](#). And, in some cases, records do not belong to any of the assigned groups.

These miscellaneous records belong to [IA/17 Ephemera](#). The “Ephemera” classification contains groups of miscellaneous records, such as a sample card which commemorates Augusta University’s 2016 time capsule initiative ([IA/17/016](#)). Many of the institutional records here are related to presidents of the college, or significant ceremonies, such as inaugurations, convocations, and graduations.
